Certified Pedorthic Technician (Canada) Examination Information

The College of Pedorthics of Canada has scheduled the examination leading to the designation Certified Pedorthic Technician (Canada). The following information outlines the eligibility requirements and application procedures.

Locations:	Vancouver BC, Calgary AB, Winnipeg MB, Toronto ON, Halifax, NS
Application Deadline:	February 10, 2012 Application form, eligibility proof and fees must be received by the deadline. NO EXCEPTIONS. (Faxed documents are not acceptable.)
Fee:	\$225.00 plus \$11.25 GST or \$29.25 HST (price may be subject to change) <i>The exam fee includes a non-refundable administration fee of \$75.00.</i>

Note: Once a candidate has successfully passed the Certified Pedorthic Technician (Canada) examination, they are required to become a member of The College of Pedorthics of Canada. All certified members must hold membership in both the Pedorthic Association of Canada and The College of Pedorthics of Canada in order to maintain certification. Members are also required to maintain a minimum \$1,000,000 in Professional Liability Insurance coverage. The College will send instructions on accessing an invoice for membership fees (on the members' only website) along with a membership information package to successful candidates. The College will not send a certificate or certification number until full payment and proof of insurance is received.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR C Ped Tech (C)

1. Employment Experience

- A candidate must have completed **1 year (2,000 hours) employment in pedorthics**
- The experience hours must have been completed prior to the application deadline.
- Only hours involving work within the pedorthic scope of practice may be considered (non-foot orthoses work does not qualify).
- The following currently-held professional designations: Certified Pedorthist; Certified Orthotist; Registered Chiropodist will be considered equivalent to 2,000 hours pedorthic experience.

2. Membership

- A candidate must be a candidate member in good standing in the Pedorthic Association of Canada.
- New memberships must be approved and in force for a minimum of 30 days prior to the application deadline.
Applications for new memberships must be received by PAC no later than January 1, 2012.

Proof of Eligibility:

The following types of documentation should be submitted to substantiate eligibility:

- signed letter from employer, or referring professional, verifying the time worked in pedorthics and the specific job duties
- detailed resume
- proof of current certification status with the certifying body of other foot care profession

The documentation of employment experience must clearly state dates of employment and number of hours worked. If the pedorthic work has been combined with other work, the documentation must clearly state what portion of the work is pedorthic.

Note: CPC reserves the right to verify the proof of eligibility through its own investigations.

CONFIDENTIALITY AND RULES OF CONDUCT FOR EXAMINEES

By applying for The Certified Pedorthist (Canada) examination and becoming a Candidate, you agree to abide by the following rules of conduct:

1. All exam candidates acknowledge that The C Ped Tech (C) examination is kept strictly confidential, and as such no materials will be released to candidates after testing other than their test results.
2. All materials created in the course of the examination (marking sheets and original test papers) become the property of The College of Pedorthics of Canada and will not be released to candidates under any circumstances.
3. Candidates understand that under no circumstances are they to remove any part of the examination from the exam room
4. Candidates will not be permitted any form of assistance from the Proctor during the exam other than clarification of wording in the written exam component.
5. Candidates engaging in disruptive or inappropriate behaviour during the examination may be dismissed by the Proctor and may receive a failing grade on the examination.
6. Candidates understand that by engaging in any form of cheating (as defined below) will result in the Proctor dismissing them from the exam and/or The CPC to take further disciplinary action as appropriate.
 - a. Cheating is defined as any form of dishonesty by the Candidate that results in unfair advantages in results for either themselves or any other Candidates.
 - b. Cheating includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - i. Making inappropriate requests of the Proctor before, during or after the examination (including solicitation for assistance or exam materials, or any other request that would grant them an unfair advantage in the examination)
 - ii. Removing exam materials from the test site
 - iii. Bringing study materials into the examination, other than those papers permitted for the practical examination
 - iv. Non-registered candidates posing as Candidates
 - v. Giving or receiving assistance during the examination
 - c. Any inappropriate behaviour will be reported by the Proctor to The CPC Board of Directors and action will be taken accordingly.
7. Any candidate with special needs (including physical accommodation or consideration regarding English as a second language) must make a request in writing at the time of application. **No requests will be considered that are received within 90 days of the examination.** All requests will be considered on a case by case basis by The CPC Board of Directors and will be accommodated as deemed appropriate.

MARK VALUES, ATTEMPTS, PROCEDURES

The C Ped Tech (C) examination is a written examination. A mark of 80% is considered a passing grade. The exam is considered to be at a university level of difficulty.

All examinees write simultaneously with proctors supervising. The College of Pedorthics of Canada marks the exams at a later date.

A failing mark requires a full re-write. An examinee is permitted an unlimited number of attempts at passing the exam.

Should an applicant withdraw prior to attempting an exam, under reasonable and verified extenuating circumstances, a non-refundable credit for the full exam fee will be given. This credit must be applied to the next available exam session. A second withdrawal will result in forfeiture of the entire fee.

EXAM FORMAT

Written Examination

- 80 multiple-choice questions (1 mark each)
- question categories: clinical anatomy/pathology (approx. 40%); pedorthic management (approx. 60%)
- 2 hour time allotment

EXAM CONTENT

The C Ped Tech (C) exam tests the standard of knowledge expected of a pedorthic technician who independently manufactures orthoses and footwear modifications using patient files produced by a pedorthist. The technician must have sufficient knowledge of anatomical terminology, pedorthic principles, materials and footwear, to fully understand patient files and to produce pedorthic devices to specifications.

Anatomy of the Lower Limb

- anatomical terminology for structures, positions, and directions (e.g., medial, distal, metatarsal head, subtalar joint)
- skeletal and muscular systems (in general, locations and actions)
- surface anatomy (fitting and manufacturing landmarks)
- anatomical anomalies and deformities (e.g., hallux valgus; claw toes; clubfoot; pes planus)

Pedorthic Management - Orthotic Devices and Footwear

- generally accepted pedorthic approaches for supporting, accommodating and/or altering biomechanics using footwear and orthotic devices (e.g., metatarsal pads, posting, wedges, lifts, rockers)
- shoe anatomy and terminology; footwear fitting; orthopaedic devices; shoe modifications; orthotic materials; casting procedures (e.g., metatarsal bar; Thomas heel; foam impression; hallux valgus night splint; elevations)

SUBJECT LIST

The following items have appeared at least once in questions on the C Ped Tech (C) multiple choice exam. Familiarity with each of these items is strongly recommended for C Ped Tech (C) exam applicants. This is not an exhaustive list; additional items may also appear on the exam.

Anatomy & Basic Biomechanics

- planes - coronal, frontal, sagittal, transverse
- actions/positions - abduction/adduction, anterior/posterior, distal/proximal, dorsal/plantar, lateral/medial, dorsiflexion/
- plantarflexion, flexion/extension, inferior/superior, internal/external rotation, inversion/eversion, pronation/supination, valgus/varus
- terms - articulate, bilateral, chafing, contracture, deviation, digit, dislocation, displacement, excavation, excision, exostosis, foot-flat, foot slap, great toe, increment, inflammation, lever, malalignment, midline, neurological, neutral, nodule, ossification, palpate, periphery, post-op, prominent, purchase, ratio, rupture, subluxation, taper, thermal, toe-off, trunk, velocity
- Bones
 - calcaneus, cuboid, cuneiform, femur, fibula, ischium, metatarsals, navicular, patella, phalange, sesamoids, sustentaculum tali, talus, tibia
 - base, condyle, head, malleolus, tuberosity
 - joints - interphalangeal, metatarsal-phalangeal, subtalar
- Muscles
 - biceps femoris, extensor digitorum longus, flexor digitorum longus, extensor hallucis longus, flexor hallucis brevis, flexor hallucis longus, gastrocnemius, hamstring, lumbricals, peroneus brevis, peroneus longus, plantar aponeurosis/fascia, plantaris, popliteus, quadriceps femoris, rectus femoris, semimembranosus, semitendinosus, soleus, tibialis anterior, tibialis posterior, triceps surae, vastus lateralis, vastus medialis
- Achilles tendon, fat pad, insertion, ligament, tendon
- Conditions & Deformities
 - arthritis, callus, claw toe, Charcot joints, diabetes, equinovarus, forefoot supinatus, forefoot valgus, forefoot varus, genu valgum, hallux limitus, hallux rigidus, hallux valgus, hammer toe, heel spur, leg length discrepancy, lordosis, mallet toe, metatarsalgia, metatarsus adductus, metatarsus prima varus, plantar fasciitis, tailor's bunion
- Foot Types & Structures
 - forefoot, hindfoot, instep, midfoot, pes cavus, pes planus, pes valgo planus, transverse arch

Orthoses

- forefoot post, heel post, heel cup, metatarsal pad, Morton's extension
- PPT, pink plastazote, polypropylene, sorbothane, Spenco, subortholen, UCBL
- foam impression, plaster slipper, neutral position

Footwear & Modifications

- backstay, collar, combination last, counter, heel, heel breast, insole, lace stays, midsole, outsole, quarter, shankpiece, sock lining, sole, throat, toe box, toe spring, tongue, topline, tread, upper
- balmoral, blucher, board-lasted, casting, extra-depth, foxing, Goodyear welt, heel height, inflare/outflare, lasting, moccasin, pattern, slip-lasting, straight last, unit sole, vamp, wheeling
- sizing - ball girth, Brannock device, heel-to-ball, heel-to-toe, width
- AFO, balloon patch, elevation, flare, lift, metatarsal bar, point stretching, rocker sole, SACH heel, Thomas heel, tongue pad, velcro, wedge
- crepe, rubber
